

Since 1985, the Lifeline program has provided reduced cost phone service to eligible families and individuals so that they can stay in touch with loved ones, medical professionals, employers, and more. The benefit may be used on one landline or cell phone per household.

In Illinois, the program is overseen by non-profit, Universal Telephone Assistance Corporation, organized under the auspices of the Illinois Commerce Commission. I handle publicity for the board.

I wanted to provide you with updated information about how an individual or family may qualify for discounted service through the Lifeline program. In addition to landline and cell phone service, some landline providers also offer reduced cost broadband.

Enclosed is a flyer, in English and Spanish, with eligibility requirements for the program. I have also included those requirements below. You will see that Federal Public Housing Assistance, which includes Housing Choice Vouchers (previously Section 8), is a qualifying program.

For recipients of Federal Public Housing Assistance, <u>an award letter with the name of the program</u>, <u>date of the award</u>, <u>name of the participant</u>, <u>and award amount OR a Public Housing lease agreement with the type of Public Housing Assistance Credit used will prove eligibility when applying for the Lifeline program.</u>

To enroll in the Lifeline program, an eligible person should <u>call the telephone provider that</u> serves their residence or a participating cell phone provider of their choice. Contact information for Illinois telephone providers is enclosed.

Lifeline eligibility

To qualify for the federal Lifeline program, individuals or families must have an income of 135% or less of federal poverty guidelines or participate in any of the following programs:

- Medicaid
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance, including Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8)
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit Programs

Illinois' Installation Program

In addition to the Federally-funded program, Illinois has a program, funded entirely through voluntary donations, to subsidize the cost of installing a Landline phone.

You're eligible for Lifeline if your income is at or below 135% of Federal Poverty Guidelines or you participate in any of the following programs:

- Medicaid
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit Program
