Reminder that we have people from the Chicago HUD field office coming to our area the week of May 21-25. They want to do site visits on May 23, 2018. This is to inform you that they may want to enter your unit on that day.

HUD is proposing rent reforms that may eliminate medical and childcare expenses for income deductions. They are also proposing to raise rents for the lowest income households and including work requirements. They are also proposing raising the adjusted annual income percentage to 35% from 30%. This means we would use 35% of your adjusted annual income towards calculation of your rent.

You will want to contact your representatives and congressmen if you are against these proposed changes.

These changes come from Washington D.C. and the Pike County Housing Authority will follow the rules and regulations set by HUD.

We are looking for a tenant volunteer to be on the Pike County Housing Board. The meetings are the 3rd Thursday of every month. If you are interested please call the office and let us know.

Work orders are done on Mondays unless there is an emergency.

Mowing

The mowing season has started so please make sure all toys and other outdoor belongings are picked up. We don't want to damage the mowers or your belongings. There will be a \$15.00 charge per occurrence if the maintenance has to do the yard clean up. There is also an extra \$10.00 charge if maintenance has to pick up any pet waste.

Flowers

You can plant flowers and other plants as long as they are next to your apartment. Keep all planters and other outdoor decorations away from the sidewalk. Items placed near the sidewalk are considered trip hazards and are not allowed.

Pools

You are allowed to have a small PLASTIC pool but it must be dumped out and placed standing up next to the building after each use. We require this due to insurance and safety issues.

Rainbow Chip Dump Cake

Ingredients

 box (4-serving size) Jell-O™ vanilla instant pudding & pie filling mix

11/2 cups milk

- box Betty Crocker[™] Super Moist[™] party rainbow chip cake mix
- container (16 oz) Betty

Steps

- 1 Heat oven to 350°F. Spray bottom and sides of 13x9-inch pan with cooking spray.
- 2 In large bowl, beat pudding mix and milk with whisk about 2 minutes or until thickened. Stir in cake mix until well mixed. Spread batter evenly in bottom of pan (mixture will be thick.)
- 3 Bake 29 to 33 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center of cake comes out almost clean. Cool completely in pan, about 1 hour.
- 4 Frost cake with frosting. Sprinkle with crushed cookies and sprinkles.

Double Barbecue Bacon Chicken Foil Packs

Ingredients

- 1 1/4 lb Yukon gold potatoes, cut in 3/4-inch chunks
 - 2 teaspoons oil
 - 1 tablespoon Italian seasoning
 - 3/4 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon pepper
 - 4 boneless skinless chicken breasts (6 oz each)
- 1 1/2 teaspoons barbecue seasoning
 - 4 slices cooked bacon, halved crosswise
 - 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese (4 oz)
 - 1/4 cup barbecue sauce
 - 2 green onions, sliced

Steps

- 1 Heat gas or charcoal grill. Cut 4 (18x12-inch) sheets of heavy-duty foil. Spray with cooking spray.
- 2 Add cut potatoes to medium bowl. Drizzle with oil; sprinkle with Italian seasoning, salt and pepper. Stir until evenly coated.
- 3 Season chicken with barbecue seasoning, and place on center of each sheet of foil. Dividing evenly, spoon potato mixture around each chicken breast. Lay bacon slices over chicken.
- 4 Bring up 2 sides of foil so edges meet. Seal edges, making tight 1/2-inch fold; fold again, allowing space for heat circulation and expansion. Fold other sides to seal.
- 5 Place packs on grill over medium heat. Cover grill; cook 10 minutes. Rotate packs 1/2 turn; cook 9 to 10 minutes longer or until juice of chicken is clear when center of thickest part is cut (at least 165°F). Remove packs from grill; cut large X across top of each pack. Carefully fold back foil; sprinkle potatoes with cheese. Top each chicken breast with 1 tablespoon barbecue sauce, and garnish with green onions.
