Please call 217-407-0707 and hit option 1 to be connected with a member of maintenance.

Emergencies include; water leak, clogged drain, broken exterior door lock/broken window lock, toilet not flushing, and no heat.

If you need to contact maintenance for any other reason, you MUST call the office. Leave a voice mail for Tonya or Lee Ann if you do not get an answer, or we are out of the office. Your work order will be entered into our system promptly and answered in <u>urgency order</u>.

DO NOT continuously call or text the emergency number for non-emergency reasons.


If you are 60 days or more past due on your rent, you will be receiving an email, a text or a letter, letting you know the status of your account. You will need to contact the office to see if you qualify for a repayment arrangement. If we do not receive any response from you, your account will be delinquent and eligible for eviction.

On days that your property is scheduled for pest control, you must put your animals up and keep the screen doors unlocked. Pest control schedules can be found online at our website under the tenant tab at www.pikehousing.com.





All paper work you receive must be signed, dated and returned to the office within 10 days of receiving it. If we do not get the completed paper work back in the allotted time frame, you will be sent a reminder letter or email. If it is still not returned, and you have not contacted the office concerning the paper work, you will be considered non-complaint, and in violation of your lease agreement.



- Eat a nutritious diet of healthy grains, fruits and vegetables.



WCMTD THE WHEELS OF PIKE COUNTY...

With potential bad weather coming in the end of Fall and beginning of Winter,

Pike County Housing Authority would like to remind our tenants that PCHA will cover the cost of West Central Mass Transits rides for medical, education, employment, shopping (local food & beverage, dry goods and pharmaceuticals), congregate meals, professional services (not including barber/beauty shops, nail salons, etc.), legal, court ordered, financial, and social service appointments.

Not covered by PCHA are shopping trips to Jacksonville/Quincy etc. for "recreational shopping", recreational activities such as restaurants, movie theaters, events, or other personal trips.

You can still use the service for your personal recreational activities but tenants would pay their own fares. Same day trips maybe accepted, upcharge fee will be tenant's responsibility.


